

How much energy storage capacity does Spain have?

Spain had 54,621.5kW of capacity in 2022 and this is expected to rise to 2,500,000kW by 2030. Listed below are the five largest energy storage projects by capacity in Spain, according to GlobalData's power database. What is Spain's energy storage strategy?

Spain's government has approved an energy storage strategy that it says will put the country "at the forefront" of what is being done in Europe and help it move towards its 2050 climate neutrality target. The roadmap foresees the country ramping up its storage capacity from the current 8.3GW level to 20GW by 2030 and then 30GW by 2050.

How does Spain's energy system work?

Storage that is currently available in Spain comes mainly from pumped hydro and concentrated solar power (CSP) plants, to which the government wants to add large-scale batteries, behind-the-metre batteries -- minimum 400 MW in 2030 -- and make the most of the vehicle-to-grid technology, according to the document.

How much does storage cost in Spain?

Namely, from 43 EUR/MWh (lower case) to 52.5 EUR/MWh and from 47 EUR/MWh (high case) to 56.5 EUR/MWh. This is comparable with the 67 EUR/MWh LCOH for the TES with retail charges. In Spain, subsidies for storage will be granted through four calls under the PERTE ERHA1 scheme.

The German utility Eon and Adeje, a municipality in southwest Tenerife, are building an innovative energy community. It is the first of its kind in Europe and so far the largest solar district in Spain. Their goal: energy to come entirely from local, renewable sources.

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The 2023 NECP proposes a 173% increase (or 85 GW) in renewable capacity by 2030 from current capacities¹; storage² is expected to increase by 487%, or 15 GW from installed capacity. Long Duration Energy Storage (LDES) can ensure renewable energy is utilised in the system while decreasing reliance on CO₂ emitting technologies

Global energy storage capacity was estimated to have reached 36,735MW by the end of 2022 and is forecasted to grow to 353,880MW by 2030. Spain had 88MW of capacity in 2022 and this is expected to rise to 2,500MW by 2030. "Adeje Verde" is the first self-consuming energy community of its kind in Europe and, as of now, the largest solar circle in Spain; Excess solar photovoltaic (PV) energy is no longer fed back to the grid, but instead passed on to neighbours living in a 2000-metre radius around the PV system
