

The Bissau City Power Distribution System Improvement Project (PDSDE) was approved in July 2018 in a context where the electricity sub-sector in Guinea Bissau was beset by several weaknesses and significant development challenges.

According to the ECOWAS Center for Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency, Guinea-Bissau is the perfect destination for the testing and demonstration of grid-connected and mini-grid solar photovoltaic (PV) systems.

The government, through its economic partners, implemented agricultural credit systems to support producers, but such initiatives have not achieved the expected success, primarily due to the lack of farmers" ...

July 2005, presidential elections returned former president Jo&#227;o Bernardo Vieira to power.<sup>3</sup> This paved the way for increased international development assistance, culminating in March 2008 ...

The African Power Platform aims to connect private and government stakeholders in Africa's power sector. The platform helps circulate and propagate tenders, intelligence and business opportunities to its members.

But the dynamics have started to change. Since February 2019, power supply has dramatically improved by a 30 MW heavy-fuel oil power ship (Karpower), wherein a private operator supplies electricity under a power purchase agreement (PPA) with EAGB (17 MW are supplied during the current 1st phase).

The Bissau City Power Distribution System Improvement Project (PDSDE) is part of the Investment and Capacity Building Programme in the electricity sub-sector under Guinea- Bissau's 2015-2020 Strategic and Operational Plan.
