

Photovoltaic shelter Guyana

Aligned with the Low Carbon Development Strategy (LCDS) 2030, the Mahdia solar PV farm is part of a broader initiative that has already installed solar PV systems in Lethem and Bartica. Improvements are also slated for Wakenaam and Leguan, among other regions. These efforts aim to increase Guyana's solar energy capacity to over 39 MW by 2025.

The Government of Guyana has designated eight solar farms along Guyana's coast, with project summaries submitted to the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) outlining an anticipated generation capacity of 33MWp. Funded by the US\$83.3 million from Norway earmarked for forest conservation, these s

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The Guyana Power and Light Inc. (GPL) is a vertically integrated state-owned public utility that generates electricity in most of Guyana along the coast. GPL operates several grids, the Essequibo Coast Isolated System which covers Region 2, the Bartica Isolated System which covers portions of Region 7, the Wakenaam Isolated System and the Leguan

Guyana's solar capabilities are set to receive a significant boost with the signing of a US \$38 million contract between the Guyana Utility-Scale Solar Photovoltaic (GUYSOL) and a Chinese company known as SUMEC to construct solar farms in Regions Two, Five and Six.

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The Government of Guyana commissioned its second mega-scale solar farm, the 1.5MW utility-scale solar PV plant at Bartica, Region Seven (Cuyuni-Mazaruni) in March 2023. At 22 off-grid locations, GEA installed over 163kWp of solar PV capacity and 800kWh of battery energy storage.
