Who is Zimbabwe Power Company (ZPC)?

Zimbabwe Power Company (ZPC) was incorporated in 1996 as an investment vehicle in the generation of electricity and became operational in 1999. The organisation has been authorised to construct, own, operate and maintain power generation stations for the supply of electricity.

What is the largest power station in Zimbabwe?

Situated in the North Western part of Zimbabwe, Hwange Power Station is the largest coal-fired power station with 920MW installed capacity which comprises of 4x120MW and 2x220 MW units. ... In 1955, it was decided to dam the Zambezi River at the Kariba Gorge to supply power to Zimbabwe and Zambia.

Which is the largest coal-fired power station in Zimbabwe?

Situated in the North Western part of Zimbabwe, Hwange Power Station is the largest coal-fired power station with 920MW installed capacity which comprises of 4x120MW and 2x220 MW units. It is the 14th largest thermal station in the Southern African region and is adjacent to Wankie Colliery Open Cast Mine. The station was built in two stages.

What is the power sector like in Zimbabwe?

The company is the major player in the Zimbabwe power sector. It has 2,300MW installed generation capacity and about 10,000GWh annual energy sales. A well-developed electricity transmission grid spans across the country and operates at 330kV and 400kV.

How many power stations does ZPC operate?

ZPC currently operates four coal-fired power stations, Hwange, Bulawayo, Munyati and Harare thermal stations, and one hydro power station, Kariba South Power Station. All five have a total of 1960 MW as installed capacity. Each power station holds a generation licence from the Zimbabwe Electricity Regulatory Authority (ZERA).

How much power does Hwange thermal power station produce?

According to the Zimbabwe Power Company (ZPC), Hwange Thermal Power Station is producing 824MW with Units 7 and 8 said to be operating at optimum levels, Kariba 558MW as it copes with tight water rationing following subdued inflows, and 48MW from IPPs.
